

**ORDINANCE NO. 12-00-4**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ABBEVILLE, ALABAMA TO DESIGNATE THE INTERSECTION OF GILLIAM STREET AND BRYANT STREET AS A FOUR WAY STOP INTERSECTION.**

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the City Council of the City of Abbeville, Alabama, A Municipal Corporation, as follows:

**SECTION I. DESIGNATION OF FOUR WAY STOP INTERSECTION**

The intersection of Gilliam Street and Bryant Street shall be designated as a four way stop intersection. Every driver of a vehicle approaching the stop sign erected on Gilliam Street and the stop sign erected on Bryant Street shall stop at the clearly marked stop sign. After having stopped, the driver shall yield the right-of-way to any vehicle already stopped at either of the three (3) other stop signs. The driver of the first vehicle which approached and stopped at the intersection shall then proceed. The driver of the second vehicle which approached and stopped at the intersection shall then proceed. The driver of the third vehicle which approached and stopped at the intersection shall then proceed. The driver of the fourth vehicle which approached and stopped at the intersection shall then proceed.

**SECTION II. PENALTY**

That any person, firm or corporation violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00), plus court costs.

**SECTION III. SEVERABILITY**

The provisions of this ordinance are severable. If any part of this ordinance is declared invalid or unconstitutional, such declaration shall not affect the part which remains.

**SECTION IV. REPEAL.**

This ordinance does not repeal any other prior ordinance concerning the regulation of public streets which has been previously adopted by the City of Abbeville, Alabama, a municipal corporation.

**SECTION V. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

The provisions of this ordinance shall become effective upon passage and publication.
